We received two very important visitors at our office at Defend Defenders! Anki Wood and Søren Østergaard Sørensen from Fojo Media Institute met us at our office on 21st November 2023. It was a rich discussion where we sat to analyze the impact of CHARM Africa in influencing the media spaces. Anki took us through a study titled "BARRIERS TO WOMEN JOURNALISTS IN SUBSAHARAN AFRICA." The study is a joint publication by Fojo Media Institute (Fojo) and African Women in Media (AWiM) which was made as part of the project, Consortium for Human Rights and Media in Africa (CHARM). The study surveyed 125 women journalists from 17 different African countries.

The African Investigative Journalism Conference, which took place at the Wits university, Johannesburg from 20-22 November 20<del>23. This remains an important event that celebrates the finest of Africa's investigative journalism.</del>

This year, #AIJC launched the inaugural African Investigative Journalist of the Year Award. Kenyan Journalist Tom Odula won the award for reporting that showed compassion in dealing with the victims in his shocking exposé titled Sex for Work: The True Cost of Our Tea.

Kenyan journalist Tom Odula became the first winner of the African Investigative Journalist Award.

On 20 December 2023, over 200 people unanimously agreed to adopt the Kigali Declaration in Kigali, Rwanda! The Kigali Declaration on the Elimination of Gender Violence in and through Media in Africa was the climax of the #AWIM conference that took place on 30 Nov – 1st December 2023. Dr Yemisi Akinbobola, the CEO of AWIM, pointed out that this is an action plan that sets a minimum standard for all stakeholders that impacts how media functions concerning African women and how gender-based violence is discussed in media.
